#### Weekly Work – Tues May 5th – Friday May 8<sup>th</sup>

#### Hi all,

I am dividing the work into 'work for each day' this week. I hope it helps some of you. This week I am prescribing English, Irish and Maths plus one other item for each day.

Also, Well Done on all your work on Mathlethics. I see a few of you have won bronze awards – Super work!

#### Tuesday

Maths – Mental Maths- Week 35 – Monday and Tuesday.

Revision from last week -Draw lines, 5cm, 8cm, 12cm, 15cm long.

Don't forget to label the lines when you are finished.

Draw a square all sides are 5cm.

Draw a rectangle, sides 6cm, 6cm, 3cm and 3cm.

Tables +/- 3. –make it fun if you can. Get your child to make out cards (1-10), the same size as playing cards with one big number on them. Turn over the top card- they must add 3 very quick and shout answer. Next time, turn over card and your child must take away 3 and shout answer.

**English-** The Green Genie – Unit 15 -Pets- read story and words at bottom of page for spellings, Activity A, p 61 (in copy), Activity B and C in book.

**Irish** – See poem Micí Moncaí. Write it out, read it out loud, draw some images from the poem, hang it up in your room.

**SPHE** – Talk to your child about any worries they have at the moment. Talk about things/ worries that are in their control and outside their control (Covid19). Draw a worry tree. Write all concerns/ worries onto tree. Hang it up!

### Wednesday

Planet Maths – p128 and p129 David's Birthday – this is nice revision but take your time on each question.

Tables - +/-3 again! Beat your parent?!!

**English-** Re read story- read every second paragraph with someone else at home. Spellings. All activities on p62. Think of some words in your home that have the y as e sound. Eg- baby.

See poem **'I like'** below. Try something similar. Look at the short lines and what lines rhyme. Have a go!

Irish- Read your new poem again.

Have a go at Irish News in your copy.

Look at my **An Nuacht** below. I think you should understand everything. Explain to your dad and mam!! As with everything, léigh é amach os ard! (read out loud).

**Science** – RTE school hub are doing a lovely lesson today on Design and Making. Tune in and give it a go.

## Thursday

Tables - +/- 4

Planet Maths - revise counting in 2's, 3's, 4's, 5's, 10's,

If your child is able for more, challenge them with counting in 6's, 7's, 8's, 9's. If your child is comfortable with the first set of numbers above, that is perfect. No easy way of doing them, just off by heart/rote learning! It is well worth it though.

Planet Maths - p130 and p131 A, B and C.

**English** – Re read story. Today read every second paragraph out loud and silently. Pick out the adjectives in the story, (they describe nouns). Write 1 page about your pet. Activity D p61.

Irish- Go back over poem. Amhrán na bhFiann song- Trup, Trup. Sing them out loud!

**History** – The Children of Lir story. This story was taught on the RTE school hub on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> April. View that on RTE player or Youtube have plenty of short versions too.

Choose any activity - Children can do diary entry of what one of the children wrote in their diary. Or/ and draw six small pictures of key events in the story. Divide an A4 page in 6 and put the events in the correct order. Ask your child to retell the story.

**Irish-** Go back over your two Irish poems- Buzzy from last week and your new poem from this week - Micí Moncaí. Say them out loud. Can anyone say them off by heart?
