Monday

Maths-

Mental Maths- Week 36 Monday

Tables: +/-5- make them as fun as you can!

Revise counting in 2's, 3's, 4's, 5's, 10's from last week.

Introduction to capacity- **capacity is the amount something can hold**. Look around the kitchen. What holds more? What holds less? What has a bigger capacity? Teapot, jug, mug etc. Find some items that show what their capacity is – e.g. milk carton/ yogurt drink/ shampoo bottle. Read the capacity of the items you have collected.

Is there anything in the kitchen that has different shape but the same capacity?

P132 – have a go at B and try a few of C. It is important to get your child to guess first.

Irish- Read Irish page below. Answer the 5 questions in copy. Write answer and question. Can you find the poem An tOctopus in your copy. Go back over it.

English – Green Genie- Unit 16 - Copper – Spellings at bottom of page. Do questions in your copy. Finish p 65 in book.

PE – In this lovely weather can you organise some circuits in your garden. Set up 4 corners (use shoes to mark spots) and decide on a different activity for each corner. Spend one minute doing the activity at each corner. If you have siblings, tell them they have to join too! Someone will need to time 1 min. and tell everyone when to move to next activity. Go around the circuit more than once! E.g. of activities – lunges, star jumps, squats etc.

Tuesday

Maths – Mental Maths- Week 36 –Tuesday.

Tables +/- 5. –make it fun if you can. Get your child to make out cards (1-10), the same size as playing cards with one big number on them. Turn over the top card- they must add 5 very quick and shout answer. Next time, turn over card and your child must take away 5 and shout answer.

Continue with capacity. If you can, show your child a 1l, 2l, 500ml, and then something small e.g. yogurt drink. A and B p 133 are nice.

C p133 can be done if you have a graduated jug / pyrex even with graduations/ markings on it. It is interesting to see how many litres a sand bucket holds. Get your child's favourite cup/ beaker, fill it with water and then pour water into graduated jug. Get your child to read the capacity themselves.

English- Re- read story- Copper. Read out loud and silently.

Put new words into sentences and do p 66.

Creative Writing – Can you write a letter to a grandparent? One page, telling them all about what you are doing and what you miss etc. Ask Mum or Dad to post it/ deliver it. I'm SURE (100%) your grandparent will love it!

Irish – Revise two Irish poems, Buzzy and Micí Moncaí.

See 12 months of year below. Use these as spellings if it suits you. These will definitely stand to your child in the coming years. Learn the phrase .. 'An Bealtaine atá ann' – It is May/ May is here.

Nice lesson on Mo Bhréagáin on RTE School Hub today at 11am.

SPHE/ Science – This week in school, we would have been learning about our hearts and lungs. See brilliant heart facts **below**. Can you get any more facts? Write/ type out these facts on a large sheet, draw your heart in the middle.

Wednesday

Maths - Mental Maths –Wednesday

Tables - +/-6 Beat your parent?!!

Fill your graduated jug at home and get your child to read the amount. Ask your child to fill the jug with 500ml of water, 1l of water. Planet Maths- p134 is nice.

Explain – $1000\text{ml} = 1\text{l}$

$500\text{ml} = \frac{1}{2}\text{ litre}$

$250\text{ ml} = \frac{1}{4}\text{l.}$

Mix these up for your child – *(How many ml in 1l, $\frac{1}{2}$ l equals how many mls?)*

English- Re read story- go back over spellings for the week.

Creative Writing – chose a country you like (one you have visited?) and look up 8 simple facts about the country. Write them into your copy. Find the country on the map.

Irish- Re –read your page of reading. Can you find the song – ‘Ó ró sé do bheatha bhaile’ in your copy?

Have a go at Irish News in your copy, (similar to last week). Look back on your copy for new things to write.

Religion – Again you can log into Grow in Love at home. We are on Theme 8; lesson 2- *I will send a helper*. There is a slideshow on the Pentecost – coming of

the Holy Spirit. There is a nice story explaining how the Holy Spirit came. There is also a slideshow on the symbols of the Holy Spirit today. The song for the week 'The Spirit of God is upon Us' should be familiar to children from last year.

No need to write anything, use this lesson as relaxation and reflection time with your child.

Thursday

Maths – Mental Maths – Thursday

Tables - +/- 6

Revise what you have learned about capacity. Revise 1l = 1000ml etc.

Have a look at very small capacities – calpol syringe, nail varnish bottle, anymore?

Today I would like you to create your own fraction wall (See below). Make it big and colourful. Stick it up near your desk. (It will help you for tomorrows work).

English – Re read story and go over spellings. P67 in The Green Genie. For more practise at 'ing' words, choose any 6 words from either A or B and put them in sentences.

Irish- Revise your reading for the week. Practise saying what months of the year it is. Do you remember your Míonna poem?

Eanáir, Feabhra, Fear sneachta ramhra etc.

Music/Art - Listening and Responding to music – Listen to **Carnival of the Animals**. <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=1L993HNAa8M> . This is a link to entire piece (23 mins long). Please don't be put off by length, it is a beautiful piece of music. If you are looking at video, it tells you the animal the music is about. Ask your child to respond to piece through movement around the room. Get your other children to join in. Respond to the music through a picture. Ask your child to draw what animals they think they hear. Where are the animals etc.?

Try revise a version of Count on Me, like 1,2,3- (Bruno Mars!) Your child knows this from the beginning of the year.

Friday

Maths – Mental Maths - Friday

Tables – Try a table test. Write out 20 tables from what you have been revising. Only allow 8 mins max. You want your child to be able to do them in their head. Adding and Take Away. Give a quick test on counting in 2s, 3s, etc

Planet Maths – p135. This may cause problems, don't worry, take your time and use your fraction wall from yesterday.

Continue with Mathletics online- I see what everyone is doing. Well Done all.

English – Do a spelling test. Read a book of your choice today for 15 mins.

Try writing an acrostic poem on Summer, (See sample below). Write the word summer down the side of page and each line begins with a letter from the word Summer. Can you try one on Corona Virus? Do whatever you can!

Irish- If you are doing the Irish spellings, try these in a test. Go back over months of year. Read your page of reading one last time.

History - RTE school hub have a lovely lesson on Tom Crean the explorer at 11am.

Again, these are suggested ideas.

Get as much physical activity and fresh air as possible and keep screen time to as late as you can in the evenings.

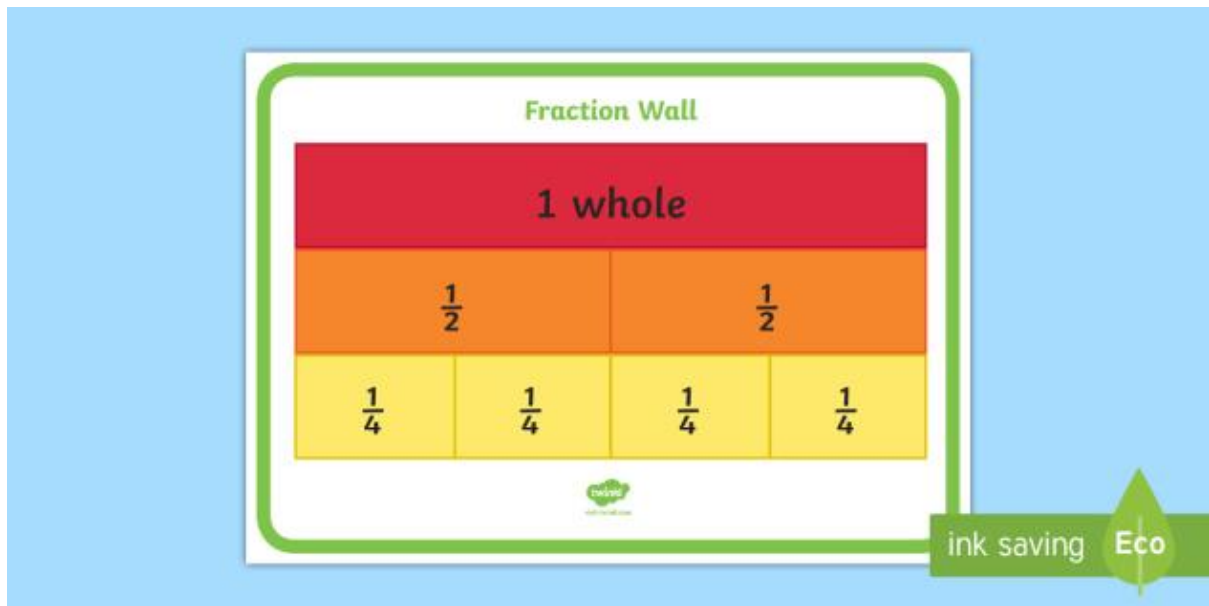

Brilliant Heart Facts,

-Your heart is about the same size as your fist

If you can, cut out 1 whole, 2 halves (the same size as 1 whole) and 4 quarters (the same size as 1 whole).

Would you rather $\frac{1}{2}$ or $\frac{3}{4}$ of the pizza? Etc.

When you think your child is comfortable with them, stick each piece onto a background like above and hang it somewhere your child will see.
