Here is work for this coming week.

Handwriting: Capital V

- start at top, Slide down and back up.
- Write people's names and places that would get the capital letter V
- Just Write pg 49-50

Phonics:

1- Tuesday & Wednesday- digraph ou

Just phonics pg 64 & 65

-explain the page to your child and then ask your child to complete by themselves.

2 -Thursday & Friday - digraph oi

-Just phonics pg 66 & 67

Spellings

- Unit 12: ee words. Learn the spellings and complete the activities on pages 58-61 My Spelling Workbook. Take a few spellings each day. Ask you child to put the word into sentences to show understanding of the meaning of the word.

Give a spelling test on Friday or ask your child to write sentences you call out that have some of these words in them.

Reading:

Take some time everyday to read to your child. Talk to your child about this book before and after you have ready it. Chat about what thy think will happen and what the book might be about, about the

title, and ask your child questions after you have read it and see can your child retell you the story in their own words.

Writing:

-News: write about the weekend. Remember to include the day and something about the weather. Maybe ask you child to write one thing that they did each day at the weekend. Your child should be able to make a good attempt to sound out most words and you should allow them to do this and then show them the correct way after of they don't get it fully correct.

- creative writing :

Ask your child to write about a pirate. Ask them to think about a pirate and what they do. Then ask them to tell you one thing about the pirate they are thinking about. Their name, something about their ship, what they like to do. Now ask your child to write a few sentences about their pirate and to draw a picture when finished.

MATHS

revision. I have attached an Easter assessment which will revise concepts your child have learned this year. You might need to give or do an example similar to the test to explain some of the tasks to you child. Take one page a day. If you have access to a printer then this is great but if you do not you can do this orally or you can write out in a simple way.

Remember to read with your child. Fairytales are great and they encourage your child to use their imaginations. If you have books that your child can read then listen to your child reading aloud and if not while you are reading a story let your child see what you are reading. Follow the words with your finger and ask your child to find words that they would recognise.

If your child is struggling with something then leave it on that day and revisit another day. I understand many of you are trying to home school while working from home so this is not an easy task. Do what you can.
