Monday:

English reading: The Talking Horse: Read Unit 30 A Lesson in Sharing. Complete A & B. Spellings.

Maths: Tables +11, Mental Maths Week 28, Chapter 29 Mathemagic 2-D shapes Hexagon. Follow p135. Explain that a hexagon has six straight sides. If all the sides are the same length it is called a regular hexagon. Make hexagons and other six-sided shapes out of different materials example lollipop/cocktail or skewer sticks. Discuss is a hexagon easy to roll. Divide the hexagon with 3 straight lines into triangles.

Gaeilge: It looks like you might be finished Ceartlitriú! Over the next week please complete sections out of chapters that you were absent for. Only complete 2 activities per day.

Litriú – spellings 3 per night.

You will need a pencil and paper to study algae, anemones and kelp that live on our seashores all around Ireland. Make some notes and draw some pictures to remember. Wednesday:

English: Read for enjoyment 20 minutes. Complete section E. Learn spellings

Think about if you met the monk on the road, what questions would you ask him?

Maths: Tables $\div 11$, Mental Maths Week 28, p137 Study the oval, circle and semi-circle. Look at the pictures in Q1 and match. Discuss Q2 and let the children investigate using a glass or cup with a different view. Complete Q3 and 4. Q5 Optional. Talk about straight sides and curved sides.

Gaeilge: Ceartlitriú (any 2 activities not completed in the book) Litriú – spellings 3 per night

History: Log on cjfallon.com and click on primary, history, 3rd class and Quest 3. You have free access to this book by signing up. Read chapter 13 about Irish Emigrant Ships. Complete activity C p72 Q1.

Thursday:

English: Reader for enjoyment for 20 minutes. The story you read this week was a Chinese folktale. All folktales, legends, myths and fables are classified as Traditional Literature. There are many other stories written in this genre in the reader. Design a poster or illustration for any folktale, legend or myths you have read in your reader or at home example the “Legend of the Giant’s Causeway.”

Maths: Tables $\times 11$, Mental Maths week 28. P138. Tessellation is when shapes fit together leaving no spaces between them. Not all shapes tessellate. Use the pictures on p138 to discuss. Children can draw various shapes and cut them out to see if they tessellate. If you have a box of simple shapes at home use them. Squares, rectangles, triangles and hexagons tessellate. Circles and semi-circles don’t because of their curved side.

Mathletics –shapes and space – Well done to the children who have worked hard on Mathletics. Most have already achieved a bronze certificate and I see many of you on the silver certificate. I wonder who’s working towards the gold!

Gaeilge: Ceartlitriú Chapter 17. Any two activities not done from any chapter, Litriú – spellings. Write 3 Irish sentences using any 3 of the following verbs in the past tense; D’ól, D’ith, Chuaigh, Thosaigh (started), Dhún (closed), Fuair (got).

Friday:

English: Read a book for enjoyment for as long as you want.

Maths: Mental Maths week 28 Mathletics shapes and space finish.

Gaeilge: Finish all activities by Friday.

Art: Watch the video again below to remind yourself how to draw a portrait.
