Handwriting: b

Sounds make words: p 26 – Identify final sounds. Label pictures on this page.

Maths: Revision: making sets

Using household items like socks/lego bricks/rice/spoons ask your child to make sets of different numbers (1-5). You call out a number and your child makes as many sets of that number as they can. You could do this activity a number of times this week, and swap around and get them to be the teacher too.

Gaeilge: On Bua na Cainte website you can continue with the Siopadoireacht theme this week. Focus on the songs and rhymes and the story.

Handwriting: p

Sounds make words; p 38, final sounds

At the end of this document you will find a picture of a hen. You can print this if you wish, or else show it to your child and get them to attempt to write down what they can see, for example: hen, nest, egg, chick. They could also attempt to write any sentence they could think of.

Sounds make words: p 70, Read and match sentence to picture


Using a ball, create a description story with your child. Keep the sentences short and in the same format, and let your child attempt to write as much as possible themselves after you write the first sentence. For example:
