Ordering of numerals:

Write out the numbers 1-10 and cut them up. Then play games with you child based around putting these numbers in the correct order; for example you put down a 5, and ask your child to put down the number before or after 5, or the two/three numbers before/after. Swap around and let your child put down the number and give the instructions.

Description story based on a mug.

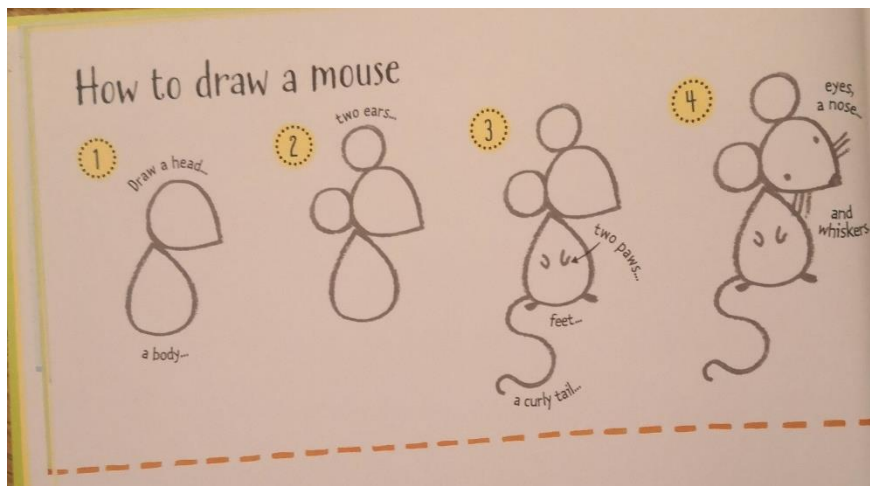
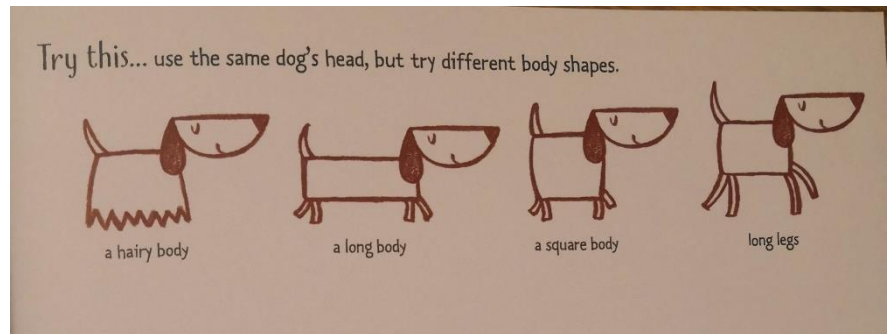
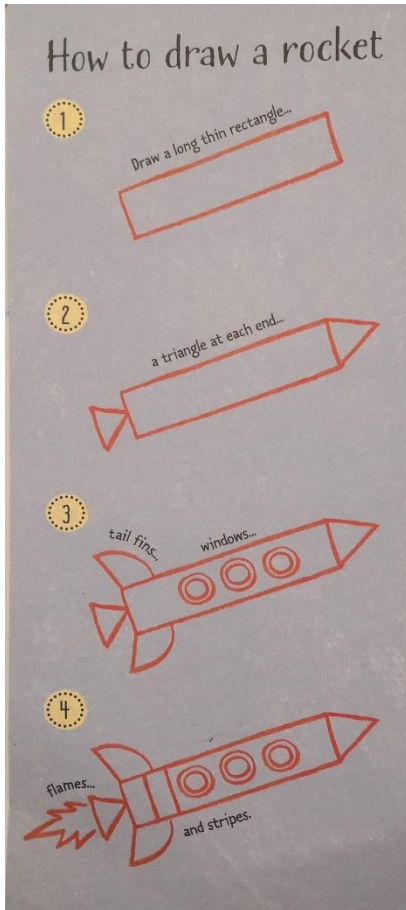
